



Practice MUN Skills – Activities

- Caucusing
 - Use fun topics students are interested in and familiar with. Walk through the caucusing process using those topics. Have students practice with each other using fun topics.
 - Use post committee topics to practice caucusing. Have each country choose 2-3 allies for each topic. This way students will learn who to collaborate with at the MUN Conference. Also identify countries who would be in disagreement.

- Writing Resolutions
 - Using fun and familiar topics, have students write resolutions following the correct structure and format. This will help students to familiarize themselves with the format before the conference.

- Debating
 - Use a topic that has global impact.
 - Break students up into groups with multiple countries and different political viewpoints.
 - Have students practice debating the topic with each other. Especially helpful for drafting arguments against countries with opposite viewpoints.

- Public Speaking
 - Have students make up a convincing story on the spot. Goal is to convince the delegation this pretend story really happened. The stranger the better!
 - Using the ridiculous stories, have students structure an argument.
 - Need to develop a thesis and have two or three supporting arguments.
 - Move on to topics that will be used at MUN and ensure students are using supporting reasons/ arguments to support their argument.
